**REGULATIONS FOR  
RECOGNITION OF HOMEOPATHIC TEACHING  
INSTITUTIONS, 1988**

In exercise of the powers conferred by clause (g) of Section 47 of the Unani, Ayurvedic and Homoeopathic Practitioners Act, 1965 (11 of 1965), the National Council for Homoeopathy, with the previous approval in writing of the Federal Government, hereby makes the following regulations, namely:-

**1. Short title and commencement:**

- (a) These regulations may be called the Regulations for the Recognition of Homoeopathic Teaching Institutions, 1988.
- (b) They shall come into force at once.

**2. Requirement for the recognition of teaching institutions:**

- (a) An institution imparting or desiring to impart education in Homoeopathy shall fulfil the following requirements for obtaining recognition under the Unani, Ayurvedic and Homoeopathic Practitioners Act, 1965, namely:-

- (b) Building:- There shall be available proper accommodation for class rooms, staff room, office, library, museum, laboratory, demonstration room, dispensary, and toilet facilities etc. Minimum covered area of the building shall be as under:-

(i)	Four lecture rooms for (60) students	18'x20' (4)	=	1440 sq. ft
(ii)	Auditorium-cum-examination hall	30'x40'	=	1200 sq. ft
(iii)	Principal's room.	12'x15'	=	180 sq. ft.
(iv)	Office.	14'x20'	=	280 sq. ft
(v)	Staff room.	12'x15'	=	180 sq. ft
(vi)	Laboratory (Clinical and Pathological)	20'x25'	=	500 sq. ft
(vii)	Two museum rooms.	18'x20'(2)	=	724 sq.ft
(viii)	Anatomy and Physiology.

(x)	Library-cum-Reading room.	18'x20'	=	360 sq.ft

- (xiv) Toilets 3 in number

N.B. Minor adjustment in the size of rooms will be permissible.

- (xv) Laboratory: There shall be a laboratory which shall have equipments apparatus, charts, models, and chemicals as specified in Annex-I.

- (xvi) Library: There shall be a library which shall have at least the books specified in Annex-II.

3. **Teaching Staff:** There shall be at least one teacher for every subject to be taught in the institution.
4. **Teaching timings:** The institution shall be a day college having no evening shift. Classes shall be held for at least 5 hours daily. The minimum duration of each period shall be forty-five minutes.
5. **Clinical training:** The institution shall have facilities for imparting clinical training.
6. **Size of classes:** In each class not more than sixty students shall be enrolled. In case more than sixty students are admitted to a class separate section shall be maintained; provided that appropriate extra lecture room and teaching staff is available.
7. **Tuition fees:** No institution shall charge tuition fees and other charges more than prescribed by the Unani, Ayurvedic and Homoeopathic System of Medicine Rules, 1980.
8. **Financial position:** For meeting the recurring expenditure, an amount of One Hundred Thousand rupees shall be at the disposal of the management of the institution and the management shall furnish a bank certificate to that effect. No grant-in-aid to the funds of the institution shall be provided for during any financial year within three years succeeding the year of recognition.
9. **Record:** Every institution shall maintain the following record:
  - (a) Student's admission register containing the name of every student, his father's name, residential address and the date of admission;
  - (b) Attendance register, class-wise.
  - (c) Staff salary register or pay roll, provident fund and old-age benefit facilities, if any;
  - (d) Staff attendance register;
  - (e) Fees and other dues receipt register;
  - (f) Income and expenditure account books, ledger etc;
  - (g) Register of assets, investments, stores, furniture, fixtures, equipments and apparatus;
  - (i) Documents relating to yearly budget duly approved by the management;
  - (j) Details of practical training facilities attached to the college.
10. **Audit:** The account of the institution will be audited annually by a Chartered Accountant, or authorised auditor (s) and their audit report will be submitted to the Council every year.
11. **Repeal:** Schedule V to the Homoeopathic Examination Regulations, 1986, is hereby repealed.
